


Fig. 1 Package outline




Fig.2 Maximum & minimum on-state characteristics

these values are valid for $T_j = 125$ °C for $I_T 50$ A to 3000A




Fig.3 On-state power dissipation – sine wave




Fig.4 Maximum permissible case temperature, double side cooled – sine wave




Fig.5 Maximum permissible heatsink temperature, double side cooled – sine wave




Fig.6 On-state power dissipation - rectangular wave




Fig.7 Maximum permissible case temperature, double side cooled – rectangular wave




Fig.8 Maximum permissible heatsink temperature, double side cooled – rectangular wave






Fig.9 Maximum (limit) transient thermal impedance - junction to case (°C/kW)








Fig.11 Single-cycle surge current




Fig12 Gate Characteristics




Fig. 13 Gate characteristics




Fig.14 Package outline
